With longer-term goals, you have to be willing to give up something you want now to get something even better in the future. That's called . But so many Americans are in credit card debt because they opt for instant gratification—to buy something as soon as they see it. The problem with putting that new shirt on a credit card is that it will probably cost a lot more in the end, compared to saving money and paying for it in cash.

So there are other factors to consider when setting a clear goal. In fact, the best goals aren't just clear-they are SMART.

Specific.	"I want to go to Panama City for Spring Break" is more specific than "I want to go somewhere fun over Spring Break."	Short-term:
Measurable.	"I'll need \$150 for my share of the hotel room for the week" is measurable; "I want to save a bunch of money for the trip" is not.	Save \$25 by the 10th of next month to buy mom a birthday gift.
Attainable.	"I'll split the driving with my friends and take \$200 more for gas, food, and other spending" is much more attainable than "I want \$500 to fly there and \$700 for spending money."	Intermediate-term: Save \$10 a week for the next six months to buy a dress for prom.
Realistic.	"I'll save \$60 a month from my paycheck for the next six months" is more realistic than "I'll buy lottery tickets every week."	Long-term: Save \$2,000 from a summer job for the next three years for a down payment on a car.
Time bound.	"I want to save all the money by March 1st" gives you a specific date from which to plan backwards, unlike "I want to save all the money by spring."






