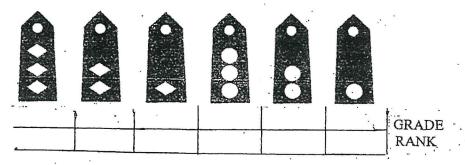

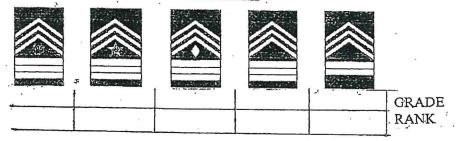

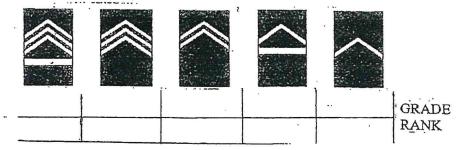

INSIGNIA OF GRADE FOR CAPET OFFICERS



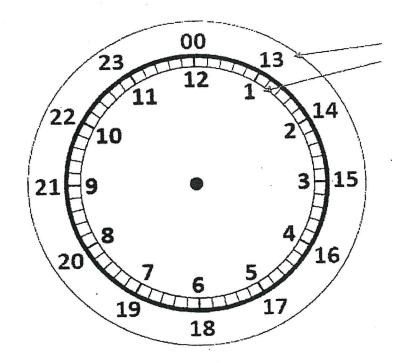
INSIGNIA OF GRADE FOR CADET ENLISTED PERSONNEL





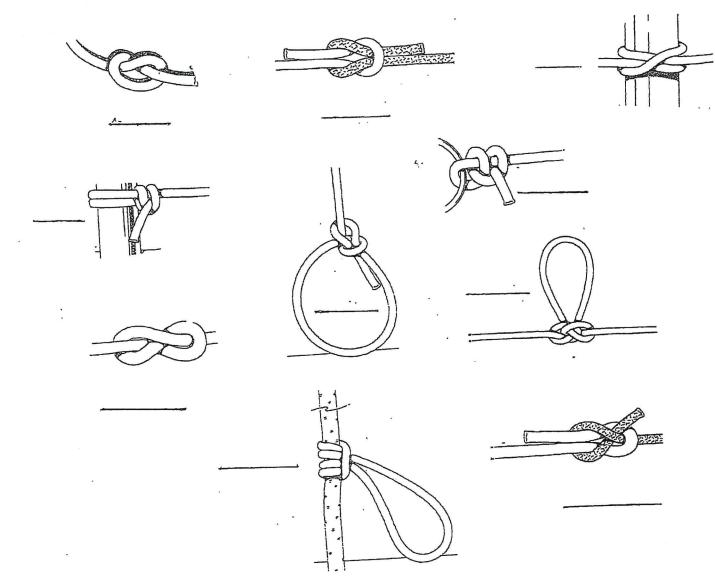
